Insecure? Look to Jesus

*... to the praise of the **glory of his grace**, wherein he has made us
accepted in the beloved.
Ephesians 1:6*

Warm Summer Greetings;

True confession time ... I battle with insecurity! There, I said it! I know some of you are probably shaking your head in disbelief. What you see on any given Sunday morning is a man who spent two hours prior to worship in prayer asking God to use me in such a way that brings him praise, honor and glory and to take away any feelings of inadequacies that may be present. Any preacher will tell you that butterflies are good and cause us to humble ourselves before a Holy God seeking His guidance and strength to bring forth His Word. But the battle is real, the queezies are real, and the dependence on God is real!

Perhaps you can relate to feeling insecure. If we are honest, most of us deal with feelings of insecurity quite often. New surroundings can seem fearful and daunting. We often wonder if we are liked, wanted, and accepted. Sometimes, we struggle with *the impostor syndrome*. We have risen to a level of influence and success, but deep down we feel we don't measure up. We fear that someone will see us for what we really are—a bundle of self-doubts, insecurities, and failures—and expose us as impostors. And when impostors get exposed, they get exiled.

Needless to say, living with insecurity is not a fun and freeing experience. It is definitely not the way the Lord wants us to live. What I have found is this ... don't look within to find security. It is not there. Look to Jesus!

Insecurity is rooted in self. We feel insecure because we know deep down that we are flawed and fragile. We often try to compensate for this insecurity by bragging on our self to others, giving our self a daily pep talk, or achieving some award or advanced degree or milestone. Alas, these worldly strategies to overcome insecurity are short-lived at best. The answer to the problem is only found in God. You will never find it in yourself.

God is a God of grace. His grace has been defined as His unmerited and undeserved love. It is by His grace that we are saved. It is by His grace that we are set



free. It is by His grace that we are “accepted in the beloved.” And the beloved is Jesus. The moment we receive Jesus as Savior and Lord, the Father accepts us! Acceptance is not achieved through merit, it is freely given through grace.

I have found, and come to believe, that the cure for insecurity is to remember that God does not accept us on the basis of who we are or how uprightly we have been living. He accepts us on the basis of Jesus. When we accept Jesus, He accepts us, completely and fully.

If you are a Christian, it’s time for you to live in the joy, peace, and security of your acceptance. Don’t look within to find security. It is not there. Look to Jesus. What the Father said to Him, He says to those who are in Him, “This is my beloved son [daughter], in whom I am well-pleased”.


- Long Range Capital Team met and established team leaders for each project and are obtaining quotes.

LIBRARY HIGHLIGHTS FOR AUGUST - Read All About It!!



It appears as though the 'dog days of summer' have come to us a bit early this year, and they may be remaining with us right into and through this month, so at those times when you need to take a break and relax from the heat and humidity, why not get one of our church library books in your hands and enjoy some great reading material? Listed below are some fine choices to consider that have just been added to the library:

In the non-fiction realm, there are two gems from the late Dr. Billy Graham. You will profit from reading either of these titles, and you will realize anew the powerful impact that this great man of God not only had, but continues to have as his writings reveal his great heart of love for his Savior and Lord Jesus Christ.

The first book is the classic **"How to Be Born Again"** and the back of the book states the following: 'Man has a problem, and God has the answer in Christ. How then do we respond? Dr. Graham gives the answer in simple, direct, and dynamic language. But he does not stop with the moment of the new birth, for newborns have a lot of growing to do. Here is the essential guidance to take them further, for they can scarcely realize so soon the potential of the new power God can release from deep within them. This book is at once universal and personal, both for the new Christian as well as the more seasoned Christian following the Way - an irresistible primer for finding salvation, and a guidebook for continuing growth.'

The second title is **"Nearing Home"** and was penned by Dr. Graham in his golden years. Here is the blurb from the book jacket: 'Scripture is filled with examples of men and women whom God used late in life, often with great impact - Noah, Abraham, Moses, Elizabeth, and Anna, to name a few. They were ordinary men and women who discovered that the latter years of life can be the most rewarding and fulfilling. "For them, growing older wasn't something to be denied or dreaded" says Billy Graham, "it was to be embraced as part of God's plan for their lives." Billy Graham's life and ministry have been dedicated to the here and now but always with a happy-ever-after in view. In this moving narrative he reflects on his life and contemplates what God still has in store for him. He also shares how he has learned to deal with grief, uncertainty, and loss by focusing on the promises found in the Bible.'

Reading either or both of these books will undoubtedly touch and inspire you and will remind you that God can use anyone to change His world, just as he used Billy Graham!

In the fiction category, there are three riveting new books to choose from. These are all additions to series that we already have, all written by talented and beloved authors.

The first preview is part of the **Hope Harbor** novels by Irene Hannon and its title is **"Driftwood Bay"**. The synopsis is as follows: 'After tragedy upends her world, Jeannette Mason retreats to the tiny Oregon seaside town of Hope Harbor to create a new life. Vowing to avoid emotional attachments, she focuses on running her lavender farm and tearoom - that is, until a new neighbor with a destructive dog and a forlorn little girl invade her turf. But she needn't worry. Dr. Logan West is too busy coping with an unexpected family, a radical lifestyle change, and an unruly pup to have any interest in his reclusive neighbor. Yet when Jeannette and Logan find themselves pulled into the life of a tattered family fleeing persecution in war-torn Syria, might they discover that love sometimes comes calling when it's least expected?'

Second to be previewed is **"Double Cross"**, which is Book 2 in the **FBI Houston Series** by DiAnn Mills. Here is the book jacket blurb: 'FBI agent Laurel Evertson's investigation into a scam targeting the elderly takes an unexpected twist when key evidence leads her to a felon she arrested on her last undercover assignment. That case has haunted her since, and though she's vowed to forget Morgan Wilmington - and what she sacrificed to put him away - he is now her best lead. Houston police officer Daniel Hilton fears his grandparents may be the scammers' next targets, and he'll do anything to protect his family, including to force interagency cooperation. But he's quickly drawn to Laurel's zeal and agrees to follow her lead...even if it means teaming up with a felon. As the unlikely trio uncovers disturbing evidence suggesting the scam is more deadly than they had imagined, Laurel and Daniel find themselves in the crosshairs of a killer. Together they must decide if they can trust Wilmington's claims of redemption, or if he's leading them straight into a double cross.'

The final fiction preview is "**The Unexpected Champion**" by Mary Connealy, which is Book 3 in the '**High Sierra Sweethearts**' series. The back of the book states the following: 'City dweller John McCall never expected to be out in the High Sierras of 1868 on a wild-goose chase to find the Chiltons' supposedly lost grandson. But now that he's out here, things have gotten even more complicated, mostly due to wildcat Penny Scott. She's not like any woman he's ever met - comfortable in the woods, with a horse, and with a gun. When Penny and John are taken against their will by a shadowy figure looking for evidence they don't have, both realize they've stumbled into something dangerous. With their friends and family desperately searching for them, Penny and John must make a daring escape. When they emerge back into the real world, they discover their kidnapper just won't stop. This city man and country woman must bring a powerful, ruthless man to justice, all while fighting a very inconvenient attraction to each other.'

Well, there you have it - some great reading choices (and there are many, many more to choose from in the library) for you to take advantage of, so come on in and check it (or them) out - happy August reading!!!

UGANDA MISSION TRIP UPDATE

Some of you might not be aware of all we do in Uganda, Africa. St. Peter's Church has adopted a village in Uganda. With the CPR funds help, we are currently drilling a well, rebuilding a church facility, and hiring a full time pastor for the church. These are just a few of the things we are doing over there. We are also working with World Vision (the group we do the walk for) to clean the two water sources in the village. As you can see a lot has been happening. The Africa mission trip team is so proud of the support we have received from our church with the yard sale. With the help of all your donations we were able to raise over \$1000 dollars. This, along with our monthly dinners, are a great start to our fund-raising. We have five members committed to the team so far and need to start making our travel arrangements soon. If you are on the fence about going with us ask one of the team members or former members how it changed their lives. It might be the push you need in your decision. We will be leaving around December 26, 2019 and will be back in Zelenople on January 12, 2020. We also need to raise \$3000 per person. We now have over \$3000 in our account and need your help. Our monthly dinners are our steady fundraisers and we would like to see more people show up each month. Also, we are going to plan another yard sale during Fall Festival in October. As you can see, we are working very hard to achieve our financial goal. Look for more upcoming events and please support us any way you can. Most of all continue to pray for this mission, the team members, and our Uganda friends.



Capital Campaign Update

The Long Range Capital Team met twice in June and once in July. The goal of our first meeting was to get a better understanding of the projects that were assigned to our team. We assigned teams and a team leader to each of the projects. We are in the process of securing estimates for two of the projects: (1) painting of the exterior church trim and (2) replacement of the gutters on the educational building. We currently have three estimates for painting and are in the process of obtaining a second and third estimate for the gutters. We hope to review all quotes and get a recommendation to Consistory by the beginning of August. The painting cannot be done until the church roof is complete. In both cases, we plan to recommend the use of funds in the 2019 budget under the capital project line. For the other projects, the teams are focusing on understanding the scope for each project before we get any estimates.

We will continue to keep the congregation informed of our ongoing progress. If any member has a question, please contact myself or any member of the team.
