Summer is a great time to get away and spend some quality time with family or to just unwind and disconnect from the chaotic world we live in. I was blessed this summer to spend some “QT” with Kendra in Berlin, OH in the heart of the Amish community. It was relaxing and beautiful. The true blessing came when we checked into our ‘hotel’ - an honest to goodness treehouse! Kendra and I were channeling our inner Tarzan and Jane!

From the president...

In 1978, I had the opportunity to attend a baseball game at Chicago's now historic Wrigley Field. My first impression, however, was far from historic – I thought the place was a dump and historic seemed just a different way of saying that.

I remember telling the group that I was with that Pittsburgh's Forbes Field was nicer than this - and they tore it down. For the record, the Cubs fans in the group did not agree to say the least. Nothing has happened in the years since to change my opinion, though – if it's historic and nostalgic you wanted, Forbes Field was hard to beat.

Since that time, Pittsburgh built Three Rivers Stadium – and blew it up – and Wrigley Field has been upgraded many times and is, supposedly, now a nice place to see a ballgame. Pittsburgh now has PNC Park which is, by most reports, one of the best places to see a ballgame, if not the very best.

The point is that sometimes you have to tear things down to see progress and, sometimes, you don't – there's no one blueprint. We're now facing that same dilemma here at St. Peter's. With Pastor Andrew's deployment this fall, we've seen three fine employees leave in 2021 and face the difficult but interesting task of almost completely rebuilding the staff.

Right now, we're looking at the situation as an opportunity – it's a rare situation when any organization gets the chance to start with a blank slate for job descriptions and build a staff to prepare to meet both current and future needs. That's the process we're starting now – and we've already begun.

The Spiritual Council has already met once with the conference minister to discuss possibilities – both in our structure and in the market of potential candidates. We're working closely with the Personnel Committee to develop the job descriptions and check the market.

It's way too soon in the process to predict how it will turn out but, whatever decision we reach, we'll be doing it to make St. Peter's the best it can be, both now and in the future. As we traverse this path, we'll do everything we can to maintain the programs we have. We've hired Judy Caldwell as the interim Christian Education Director and likely will be adding some others with interim job titles while we move towards a permanent solution.

It's likely that we will also need additional volunteer help during the transition and please consider helping us out if you can. As always, we also ask that you continue to pray for God's guidance at St. Peter's as we move towards a new structure.



Now that summer is fully upon us, it's in these times, when you need to take a break and relax from the heat and humidity, why not get one of our church library books in your hands and enjoy some great reading material? Listed below are some fine choices to consider that have just been added to the library:

The first three books are from the *New York Times* best-selling author of "*The Harbinger*" and "*The Book of Mysteries*", Jonathan Cahn:

Police detectives think she's a danger to the case, and her colleagues worry her obsession will be detrimental to her health. But Lilly can't stop, even if it means digging into a dark mystery that science cannot comprehend. Alone and on the run, Lilly wonders: is there any proof that will bring a monster to justice?'

Library Highlights continued...

The final additions to our church library this month are a series of six books (Journey of the Heart) from bestselling author Colleen Coble and all six books have been given in memory of Mary Lou Burkett by her daughter, Janet LaRocca:

“A Heart’s Disguise” Journey of the Heart, Book 1: ‘While the tiny town of Wabash, Indiana, celebrates the end of the fighting, Sarah Montgomery attends the parties, but inside she’s fighting a deep sadness. The love of Sarah’s life, Rand Campbell, didn’t come back from the front. So her brother and ailing father persuade her to pledge herself to another man—despite her misgivings. When Sarah finds out that Rand is in fact alive—and that her fiancé Ben Croftner knew it—she indignantly breaks off their engagement. Croftner doesn’t take rejection lightly—and a single woman with a sick father makes an easy target. He abducts Sarah, his intentions anything but honorable. Then Rand comes to her aid... only to reveal he has been posted at Fort Laramie, Wyoming, and asks her to go with him as his wife. Will Sarah leave her dying father’s side for the only man she’s ever loved? And what plans are forming in the jealous heart of Ben Croftner?’

“A Heart’s Obsession” Journey of the Heart, Book 2: ‘When her father succumbs to a long illness, Sarah Montgomery is freed from duty to family. At last she can be with the love of her life, Rand Campbell, who has gone out west to Fort Laramie, Wyoming. Sarah and her younger brother Joel make the arduous journey filled with hope. But at Fort Laramie, the reception Sarah meets isn’t what she had hoped for. Her friend Amelia is thrilled to have her, but Rand seems to be in the clutches of Jessica DuBois, the scheming daughter of the post commander. Sarah resolves to remain at Fort Laramie and try to win Rand back. But things will get tougher before they get easier... especially when her ex-fiancé Ben Croftner arrives in Wyoming, obsessed with having her back in his arms.’

“A Heart’s Danger” Journey of the Heart, Book 3: ‘Christmas is coming, and the air at Fort Laramie has turned cold... but relations with the Sioux have turned colder. As tensions between soldiers and natives approach a tipping point, a trap has been set for Rand Campbell. Rand’s new fiancée wants to keep him from returning to Sarah Montgomery... for whom his heart clearly still yearns. Sarah just wants to move on with her life at Fort Laramie, but she’s doing so under the watchful eyes of both Campbell—the man whose love she craves—and Ben Croftner—the man whose lies have cost her everything. Will Rand fall victim to the conspiracy and go through with his wedding? Or will he declare his love for Sarah and make good on the promises that brought her into the rugged western territories?’

And it seems Emmie may have to fulfill that promise. But can she live happily without Isaac?’

“A Heart’s Home” Journey of the Heart, Book 6: ‘Isaac Liddle is keen to marry Emmie, and she knows she shouldn’t hide her pregnancy from him any longer. But before she can tell him her secret, a widower friend asks the impossible of Emmie: Will she honor her promise to his dead wife by marrying him to care for the orphaned baby? With the Sioux Wars threatening outside the fort, Emmie’s solemn vow threatens her happiness from within. Will she honor a promise sure to break her heart—and Isaac’s? Or is there another way to find a home for her heart?’
