## A Love Worth Confessing

Many people in my generation grew up listening to 90's R&B music. Much of that genre was known for being smooth and even romantic. One of the most popular artists in that genre was Usher, who will highlight the Super Bowl Halftime Show this month. One of the best known albums by this skilled singer and dancer was called "*Confessions*", with the hit song "*Confessions Part II*". Later expansions of that album included "*Confessions Part I*". Apparently, Usher had a lot to confess, even as he lyrically tried to get his girl to stay with him, in spite of all he had done. Usher wasn't the only one to write on this topic, though. Take, for example, singer and Broadway star Josh Groban. One of this golden-throated baritone's popular early hits was a song called "*My Confession*". Just a few of the "confession" songs out there.

What is it about *loving* someone that makes us willing enough (vulnerable enough) to confess our flaws... our shortcomings... our sins to them? Perhaps its our desire for them to know our *true* selves. Perhaps its the security (or, at the very least, the hope) that they will love us no matter what they discover about us, even the negative. I remember asking one of my best friends if I should ask Susan to marry me. "David", he said, "You found a woman who knows all your flaws and loves you *anyway*. I'd marry her *tomorrow*". Similarly, I don't think it's out of the question to see *God's* love for us in that way.

What makes God different, though, is that God *already knows* everything about us, especially anything we could confess to Him (Ps. 69:5, Ps. 139:3-4). So if God already knows everything we've ever done, then confession must be for *our* benefit, not His. The NT Greek word "*confess*" literally translates "*Same word/mind*". The idea is that you no longer silently conceal the action you've done, but now state that the action you've done *and* your words declaring it *agree*. This is not a comfortable thing to do, but it greatly strengthens a loving relationship between two parties. No wonder "confession is good for the soul". So, with a month often associated with love here before us, it is my hope that we might shift our thinking about confession... from "airing my dirty laundry" to "becoming vulnerable enough to not let concealed misdeeds become a hurdle to my relationship with the one I love". The one who loves us *most* guarantees forgiveness of the sins we confess (1 Jn. 1:9). In light of that, I'm issuing a "Repentance Challenge" for the month of February, which will mark the beginning of Lent. "Repent" (the first word Jesus ever taught) is just a fancy word for a U-turn from the sins we confess. *His* love makes repentance worth it ~**Pastor David**

## UGANDA MISSION TPL NEWS

Greetings St. Peter's,

Well, we are back. It was a long 66 hour trip to get home. All was fine until we got into the USA. Had an unforeseen lay-over in LaGuardia airport for 24 hours due to weather, but we are glad to be home. It was a wonderful trip this year and we accomplished so many things. Our friends in Kalyango are doing great. The village is jigger free and wounds are all healing. The well and the latrine that we built were a big part of that. The church has a paid full-time pastor, thanks to CPR funding, and now the village is building her a house next to the church. The village is now self-sustaining, which is what our goal has been. We are now moving onto another village where a new church building and a latrine is needed. While we were there, the drilling rig from Ceed drilled a new well. So they will have fresh water already there to start their rebuilding. We renamed our group to Uganda Mission TPL which stands for 'treat, preach and love'. Our mission has slightly shifted from trying to build and maintain churches and villages to helping churches and villages to build for themselves and become self-sustaining like Kalyango. We also were able to provide a pastor's salary to Pastor Andrew who is currently the pastor of Open Door Church. He is one of the people who help us in our medical work every year. Again, thanks for CPR supporting this endeavor. There is so much I can get into, but this is long enough already. Come to the stuffed chicken breast dinner **Friday, Feb 9th** and ask about our trip. We are taking orders for 6" Italian hoagies for pick up that night also. Let Jim Schulz know how many you need by **Feb 6th** or give Randy a call at 724-766-1029. Hope to see you all at the dinner.

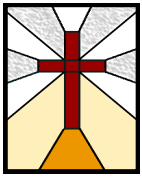

### HAVE YOU EVER THOUGHT OF PLAYING HANDBELLS?

So many people love to hear the sound of any kind of bells because they always seem to sound so joyful and melodious. The members of St. Peter's Handbell Choir not only enjoy the sounds of our handbells, but they also have the pleasure of working and fellowshiping together to produce the wonderful sounds of so many songs that they have played throughout the years here at St. Peter's. Our handbell choir ministry is celebrating its 19<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year, having had its beginning in 2005 when Kendra Bertoti had the vision of our church using handbells to praise the Lord in worship and offered to direct the group if Consistory would allow the purchase of a three-octave set of bells.



Consistory did approve, and Kendra ended up directing the bell choir through 2021 and when we needed a new director, Melissa graciously accepted the position in early 2022 (and she has been doing a wonderful job these past two years!) At some point in time, a set of handchimes was added (they are fun to play as well) and the choir has learned many different techniques of playing that showcase the various sounds the bells can produce.

Our current handbell choir consists of a few people who have been members since 2005 right up to people who have joined in just the past year or two. Even though there is a fixed number of people who are in the choir due to only having the three octaves of bells, Melissa is always looking for people who would be interested in joining if there would be an opening or even just to substitute if that need would arise. New members don't need to have prior experience in handbell playing, nor do people have to be trained in reading music. Lots of things can be taught in rehearsals, and as well as being a very skilled director, Melissa is also a very patient one! Men are always welcome to join the choir, as are teenagers who are really interested and are able to consistently attend rehearsals.

In the midst of so much joy and fun getting to learn new techniques and skills as the handbell choir prepares songs to be played in our worship services several times each year, the hearts of Melissa and the ringers remain focused on serving the Lord, bringing Him the honor and glory He is due, with every note they play. Just as they were when they began almost 20 years ago, our handbell choir is a ministry that truly "makes a joyful noise unto the Lord!" 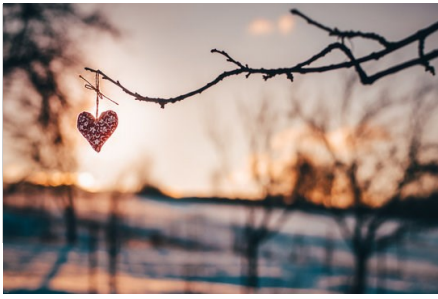
