They have everything, and yet they are so unhappy. I had no inner peace. I was a puppet on a string."

Isn't that scary and sad? Becker had all the things the world says will make for happiness, yet he was so incredibly unhappy. Could it be that true happiness is not found in health, wealth, and achievement?

The Bible makes it clear that true happiness comes when you and I are right with God. When we are yielded to Christ and His will for us, then we can experience true happiness—inner peace and unspeakable joy. Are you right with God today?

Are your sins confessed to Him? Are you living surrendered to the Lordship of Jesus Christ?






MARK YOUR CALENDARS!!



LIBRARY HIGHLIGHTS FOR JANUARY - READ ALL ABOUT IT!!

A brand new year of reading possibilities is upon us, and listed below are some great new additions to our church library, both fiction and non-fiction.

Heading the list are some additional books in the best-selling **'Great Lives from God's Word'** series written by pastor, educator, and author Charles Swindoll. To give some background on this beloved man whose speaking and writing ministries have meant so much to so many, not only has Pastor Swindoll served at numerous churches during his career, he is also the founder of the radio program 'Insight for Living'. In 1994 he became the president of Dallas Theological Seminary and now serves as its chancellor. He has written more than 70 books (and in addition to this series that I am writing about, we have more than 30 of Swindoll's books in our church library) - through all that this man has done, he has touched many lives and has been used mightily by God. What Charles Swindoll does in the **'Great Lives from God's Word'** series is to examine the lives of various Old and New Testament characters, and he does so in a very engaging and easy-to-read fashion. The volumes that we already had from the collection are: **"Job"**, **"Elijah"**, **"Jesus"**, and **"Paul"**. Adding to the series now are these volumes: **"Joseph"**, **"Esther"**, and a compilation of lesser-known Old Testament characters titled **"Fascinating Stories of Forgotten Lives"**. If you decide to read one of these fascinating character studies, you will probably want to read them all!

Another great read to preview this month is from another beloved Charles, Dr. Charles Stanley, who has been the senior pastor of the First Baptist Church in Atlanta and founded the 'In Touch' radio and television ministry, which is known to people all over the world. Just like Charles Swindoll, we have a number of Dr. Stanley's books in our library, and this book now added is titled **"Standing Strong - How to Storm-Proof Your Life With God's Timeless Truths"**. The blurb from the book jacket will truly pique your interest as it states: 'When the hurricane winds of adversity strike suddenly and relentlessly, when you are blindsided by forces that knock you off your feet and leave you stunned and bewildered...will your anchor hold? Will you weather the storm? This powerful book from Dr. Charles Stanley outlines the most foundational and essential truths about God and His Word - and reminds us that what we believe about these big issues will make or break who we are and how we live. **"Standing Strong"** is the product of Dr. Stanley's lifelong journey of defining his convictions, based on God's Word, and choosing to stand by what he believes...no matter the consequences. By sharing the hard-won wisdom he has gleaned through a lifetime of faith, he guides us as we examine and shape what we believe, so that we can live strong with confidence, hope, and an assurance that when our convictions are based on God's truths, we can weather any storm as we hold tight to him.' This book's content and insights could provide you with a meaningful way in which to begin the new year!

Rounding out this month's reading possibilities is the newest book in the fiction series **'Montana Rescue'** written by best-selling author Susan May Warren. The title of this fifth novel is: **"Storm Front"** - here is the synopsis from the back of the book: 'A tornado has destroyed a small Minnesota community, and among the missing are not only a group of students but also PEAK Rescue team leader Chet King. Ty Remington will stop at nothing to rescue his mentor, not even when the girl he loved - and lost - walks back into his life. But Brette needs his help more than he knows, despite her stubborn determination to push him away. And when he gets a second chance, loving her just might cost him more than he can imagine. A blogger for Vortex Storm Chasers, Brette Arnold didn't expect her adventures to land her in the same place as Ty, the guy who she walked - actually, ran - from over a year ago. She had her reasons - good ones. The kind that tell her that falling for him again would only lead to heartache. But Ty isn't the kind of man to give up - not on the missing students or her.' Just as the first four books in the series did, it sounds like this is one will also keep you on the edge of your seat!

So there you have it - there's something for everyone in the library as we begin 2019 - come 'check out' the many, many choices that are available and I believe you will not be disappointed! Happy winter reading!

Dear St. Peter's,

By the time you get this we will already be in Uganda. We were so blessed by the support and many donations that we have received for this year's trip. It has been so exciting to see how much more we have grown in this mission of our church. As you might have heard we are going to be starting construction of a church in the area of Pele. The reason I say area is because the church is being built in a central location of three villages. This way it will be accessible to many people. The church will be called St. Peter's Uganda. In the same area we will be building a latrine and a well is already being drilled as I write this. We have also hired a medical team to assist in caring for the well-being of the children in the area. This was made possible through the communion offering donation from August. CPR and North Star Helping Hands Foundation have generously provided the funds for the building materials for the church and we have two sewing machines and material to help the sewing school in Hoima. These are just a few of the big projects we have going on plus there are many others that are being funded from our general funds. Here is our tentative schedule for the days we are there:

Dec 29: Joseph village and Men's Bible study at orphanage
Dec 30: Joseph church followed with prison visit; Pastor Will and Randy preach
Dec 31: Bulindi, a small village with veterinarian needs
Jan 1: School celebration Christmas and New Year's feast for the children
Jan 2: Kamugembe II Medical help
Jan 3: Joseph village, another small village with medical and farming needs
Jan 4/5: Break day / tour
Jan 6: Kikoroby where Pastor Will and Randy will preach
Jan 7/8: Pele
Jan 9 -12: Your villages and coffee farm

As you can see, we will be quite busy. All of this could not have happened without all of you. We now need your support through prayer! Please look at the schedule and pray for each day that we can continue to do God's work! We love you all and look forward to telling you about our trip when we return.
