Love Like Jesus Does

"My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you."

John 15:12

Dear Fellow Christ Followers:

As I write this month's note, our country is in the throws of racial tension like none I have ever witnessed. I was a bit young to remember the turmoil that surfaced in the late 1950's and early 1960's, but know my history well enough to know the efforts of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and Rosa Parks and others who had helped to advance racial equality in our land. One quote by Martin Luther King that has stuck with me is "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only LOVE can do that." Read that quote again... slowly and listen to the words as they roll across your tongue: darkness and light; hate and love. The negative can be extinguished with the positive.

Jesus spoke of us being "the light of the world and that we are to let our light shine before men." Matthew 5: 14-16. You see, evil lurks in the darkness, but when light is cast upon the darkness, evil is chased away. It is our responsibility as Christian men and women to be the "light" of Christ and to chase evil and darkness and hate and racism and bigotry and lies and deceit away, for nothing good can come from the darkness.

Our duty as Christ-followers is to share love with all people, no matter the color of one's skin or their ethnicity or their gender, for Jesus' words tell us that the two greatest commands are to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, strength and mind; and love your neighbor as yourself." These aren't suggestions of Jesus—they are commands; expectations of how we should treat our relationship with God and our relationship with others.

Racism begins with a lack of love. You can't love someone like Jesus does and harbor prejudice in your heart. It's impossible. We must love everybody the way Jesus does. He even gets super specific in John 15:12: "My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you." Jesus loves us unconditionally, freely, completely and continually. It's our commitment as Christians to love the same way.

Love doesn't mean we approve of everything someone else does. Jesus doesn't approve of everything people do (just read the account of the adulteress in John 8:1-11), but he still loves us. Thank you Jesus!



The bible says we must be imitators of Jesus and our attitudes should be like his (Philippians 2:5). How is your attitude toward your fellow citizen? Your fellow citizen of a differing color or ethnicity? Together when we love like Jesus does, we can be the light and chase the darkness away and change hate with love. Are you ready to love like Jesus does?

Often people are quick to respond with emotion and anger before listening to others. It is okay to have different ideas and thoughts than others, it is okay to disagree with someone but still love them, it is okay to love your enemy. The world around us is a challenging and diverse place, it is also easy to conform to the ideas and pressures of this world. However, as Christians we are called to be above that, Romans 2:12 says "Do not conform to the pattern of this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will." We are to look to God and place our trust solely in him and nothing else. God is perfect and God is the only one who can truly restore peace to this troubled world. No politician, no celebrity, no pastor even, only God is the one.

Moving forward, as we adjust our ministries and plan some of our events, please be patient. Many of our amazing ministry leaders have been navigating these difficult waters, so I ask that you please continue to pray from them and our leaders here at church. As we continue to move forward I would like to encourage you to prayerfully consider how you may better serve here at St. Peter's in whatever capacity you feel safe and you feel God's leading. As one body, we can and we will endure any challenge we face. Stay safe, stay patient, and stay praying!



Library Highlights for July -

READ All About It!!

The first book preview this month starts out with a memorial book for our church library donated in memory of David Kennedy by Mary Lou Burkett.



“The Traitor’s Pawn” “written by Lisa Harris: “When FBI agent Jack Shannon arrives in Corpus Christi, Texas, he is focused on one thing: find the man who has been selling encrypted government secrets to the Chinese. But when a senator is shot during a hunting trip and the woman he was with is abducted, Jack agrees to join the search—especially when he discovers that the kidnapping victim is Aubrey Grayson, a woman he was once in love with. As the search continues, it becomes clear the senator may not have been the intended victim—and Aubrey may be connected to the other case Jack is supposed to be working on. Can Jack untangle the knots before it’s too late? And when he learns the truth, will it be too painful to get past?”

The next two books are both brand new to our church library.

“The Book of Lost Friends” written by Lisa Wingate a new historical novel: the dramatic story of three young women searching for family amid the destruction of the post-Civil War South, and of a modern-day teacher who learns of their story and its vital connection to her students’ lives. Lisa Wingate brings to life startling stories from actual “Lost Friends” advertisements that appeared in Southern newspapers after the Civil War, as newly freed slaves desperately search for loved ones who had been sold away. **“Louisiana, 1875:** In the tumultuous era of Reconstruction, three young women set off as unwilling companions on a perilous quest: Hannie, a freed slave; Lavinia, the pampered heir to a now destitute plantation; and Juneau Jane, Lavinia’s Creole half sister. Each carries private wounds and powerful secrets as they head for Texas, following roads rife with vigilantes and soldiers still fighting a war lost a decade before. For Lavinia and Juneau Jane, the journey is one of stolen inheritance and financial desperation, but for Hannie, torn from her mother and siblings before slavery’s end, the pilgrimage west reignites an agonizing question: Could her long-lost family still be out there? Beyond the swamps lie the limitless frontiers of Texas and, improbably, hope. **Louisiana, 1987:** For first-year teacher Benedetta Silva, a subsidized job at a poor rural school seems like the ticket to canceling her hefty student debt—until she lands in a tiny, out-of-step Mississippi River town. Augustine, Louisiana, is suspicious of new ideas and new people, and Benny can scarcely comprehend the lives of her poverty-stricken students. But amid the gnarled live oaks and run-down plantation homes lie the century-old history of three young women, a long-ago journey, and a hidden book that could change everything.”

“Starfish Pier” written by Irene Hannon which is Book 6 of the **“Hope Harbor”** series: “A year ago, ex-Delta Force operator Steven Roark left the rigors of combat behind to run fishing charters in Hope Harbor, decompress, and talk some sense into his kid brother. Business is good—but making peace with his past is more challenging than he expected. First-grade teacher Holly Miller leads a low-profile existence—until she’s recruited to advocate for a cause that’s dear to her heart. When she solicits Steven’s assistance, sparks fly—especially after they find themselves on opposite sides of an issue that disrupts their placid seaside community. As these two seemingly incompatible souls wrestle with their differences, might they discover more common ground than they expect—and a future filled with promise?”

I’ll close with a new DVD added to our library: **“Overcomer”** is from the creators of the #1 box-office hit WAR ROOM. “Life changes overnight for coach John Harrison (Alex Kendrick) after he loses his basketball team and is challenged by the school’s principal, Olivia (Priscilla Shirer), to coach a new sport he doesn’t know or like. As John questions his own worth, he dares to help the least likely runner take on the biggest race of the year. Filled with a powerful mix of faith, humor and heart, this inspirational story will have you on the edge of your seat.”






Launah Grace Cunningham
