Kick Him to the Curb!

(The Devil, that is!)

"In your anger do not sin: Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, and do not give the devil a foot hold." Ephesians 4:26-27

Happy Summer!

Can you believe that we are already halfway through the year 2021? Time ... slow ... down!

A friend has sent me a few references on 'forgiveness' as I'm thinking of doing a few sermons on the topic. So, as I do with all of the series that I consider, I have been praying on the subject. Forgiveness is a tough one, wouldn't you agree? Whether you need to offer forgiveness to someone—saying "I forgive you" or whether you need to seek forgiveness—asking "I'm sorry, please forgive me?" It's never easy and often times very humbling.

Let's face it: everyone gets angry from time to time. Anger comes in two forms. There is righteous anger over sin and injustice. That type of anger is appropriate. The Lord gets angry over such things. But, there is also unrighteous anger where we get mad because we got hurt. To be sure, every hurt inflicted upon your heart and mine will turn to anger. It is just the natural human response to hurt. Every "ow" seems to be followed up with a "pow." Can I get a witness?

The big question is what do we do with the anger? If we don't take it to God and leave it with Him, we are in for trouble. When we let the sun go down on our anger and hurt feelings, we open the door to the devil. Every "sad" turns into a "mad." If you and I don't rightly process the "mad" by the grace of God and choose to forgive the one who hurt us, the sun goes down on our anger ... and things go from "mad" to "bad."

An angry, wounded heart quickly becomes a resentful, bitter heart when the anger is allowed to simmer and stew. Resentment and bitterness attract the devil like a magnet, giving him an opportunity to set up shop in our mind and our heart. Many once-godly Christians have been ruined by resentment and bitterness. Because they refused to forgive someone for hurting them, they opened the door to the evil one who "comes only to steal, and kill, and destroy" (John 10:10). When the devil gets a foothold, he turns it into a stronghold. Your Christian life will come to a grinding halt unless and until you rightly process your hurt and anger and choose to forgive and set the offender free.

Sometimes people get confused about this thing called forgiveness. They equate it with reconciliation. They think if they forgive the person who hurt them terribly, they will need to invite them to their Fourth of July Picnic ... and they struggle greatly with the mere thought of that horror.

Forgiveness is unilateral. It is you making the choice, by God's grace, to release your offender from the mental and emotional dungeon to which you have "rightly" confined them. The truth is your offender is not really incarcerated, you are. Un-forgiveness is like burning down your own house in order to kill a rat. The rat scampers off, and you are left to sift through the ashes. Forgiveness, on the other hand, is opening the dungeon door and setting the captive free, only to find the real captive was you. The wisest thing any of us can ever do when we are struggling through "sad" and "mad" is to make the conscious choice to pardon our debtor and turn all vengeance over to God. He is the Judge, and He will repay at the proper time.

Reconciliation is bilateral. It takes willingness on the part of the offended and the offender to have reconciliation. The offender must come in humility and repentance, seeking forgiveness and restitution, and the offended must grant the forgiveness. When both parties come together, reconciliation can take place. If I may offer a very personal illustration? I recently received a letter from Lucas' biological father seeking forgiveness for all the wrongs he had done against my family. It was a difficult letter to read and as much as I wanted to not grant the forgiveness, I kept hearing the voice of Jesus when he told Peter, "... you must forgive not seven times, but seventy-seven times." (Matthew 18:21-22)

For the longest time I held hatred in my heart for hurting my little girl and for abandoning her and my little buddy in their time of greatest need. Things changed, however, when the truth of Ephesians 4:26-27 sunk into my heart. You see, I was giving the devil a place through my bitterness and hatred. I wasn't hurting him, I was only hurting myself. When the proverbial two x four hit me, **I chose to forgive** and turn all the hurt and anger over to the Lord. I have forgiven him and hold no ill will in my heart toward him, after all, I'm blessed with a wonderful little boy who calls me 'Dappy!' That relationship will never be reconciled, but it is forgiven. The devil has no place in my heart for that hurt. The devil lost his foothold and stronghold that day. I, the real captive, was **set free!** Today, I like to think I am a joyful Christian because I simply obeyed the Lord and forgave my offender. Don't get me wrong, I haven't forgotten, but **because of Jesus, I have learned to forgive and live!**

The freedom I experienced can happen to you ... if you will choose to forgive from your heart. I'm not sure who needs to read this article, but if the Lord is tugging at your heart strings to offer forgiveness or to seek forgiveness, **STOP LETTING THE DEVIL HAVE A FOOTHOLD** and **KICK HIM (the nasty Devil) TO THE CURB!** You deserve to be happy and free ... it's a wonderful feeling!

We already have the carillons in place, thanks to a generous individual donation. If you're near the church at 9:00, Noon, 3:00, or 6:00, you probably already know that. If you haven't been heard them yet, it's worth a change in schedule at some point to do so.

The trustees have done an impressive job so far this year so you're likely to see more changes over the next months as well but, there's no need to wait. Come back and see us as you feel comfortable.



READ All About It!

Now that June is upon us, it's time to relax and read, and the truth is that when you read a good book, it's a very relaxing way to spend your time!



We have two fiction books from author Nancy Mehl from her Kaely Quinn Profiler series, Book Two and Three and then another fiction book by author Kim Vogel Sawyer.


“Fire Storm” Kaely Quinn Profiler, Book Two by Nancy Mehl: ‘When FBI profiler Kaely Quinn’s brother asks for help caring for their unwell mother, Kaely finds herself headed to Darkwater, Nebraska. When she arrives, she learns the small town has been facing a series of fires. While the fire chief attributes them to the misuse of space heaters in the frigid winter, Kaely identifies a pattern that makes her suspect they were no accident. After yet another blaze devastates a local family, Kaely’s suspicions turn to certainty. Together with her partner from St. Louis, Noah Hunter, and her brother’s firefighter neighbor, Kaely and her team begin an investigation that swiftly leads them down a twisted path. When the truth is finally revealed, Kaely finds herself confronting a madman who is determined his last heinous act will be her death.’

“Dead End” Kaely Quinn Profiler, Book Three by Nancy Mehl: ‘When a body is discovered in a field in Iowa, the police uncover fourteen additional corpses, some from twenty years ago, others from the recent past. The remains point to a serial killer with an MO the authorities have seen before—Ed Oliphant, a man who has been in prison for more than twenty years ... and is FBI Special Agent Kaely Quinn’s father. After several failed attempts to discover if Ed has been training someone to be a copycat killer, the police turn to Kaely in St. Louis for help. Kaely promised herself she would never step foot in her hometown or set eyes on her father again. She’s always refused to confront her past, but if she wants to prevent any more deaths, she must come face-to-face with the man she’s hated for years. As more bodies are discovered, Kaely races against time and her own inner turmoil to uncover the killer. Will this most personal case yet cost Kaely her identity and perhaps even her life?’

“The Librarian of Boone’s Hollow” by Kim Vogel Sawyer: ‘During the Great Depression, city-dweller Addie Cowherd dreams of becoming a novelist and offering readers the escape that books had given her during her tragic childhood. When her father loses his job, she is forced to take the only employment she can find—delivering books on horseback to impoverished coal-mining families in the hills of Kentucky. But turning a new page will be nearly impossible in Boone’s Hollow, where residents are steeped in superstitions and deeply suspicious of outsiders. Even local Emmett Tharp, the first in his family to graduate college, feels the sting of rejection after returning to the tiny mountain hamlet. And as the crippled economy leaves many men jobless, he fears his degree won’t be worth much in a place where most men either work the coal mine or run moonshine. As Addie also struggles to find her place, she’ll unearth the truth about a decades-old rivalry. When someone sets out to sabotage the town’s library program, will the culprit chase Addie away— or straight into the arms of the only person who can help her put a broken community back together?’

Remember that there are lots of great books in our church library to take a chance on as we head into these relaxing summer months ahead, so come on in and check them out!




## SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL & SUMMER JR. CHURCH
