The Faith of a Child

"I tell you the truth, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." Mark 10:15

Happy Spring Greetings ...

I pray that your Lent and Easter season was a time of reflection, repentance and renewal. Our services were well represented: Thank you to the Sunday school classes for ushering in Holy Week on Palm Sunday; thank you to the Ding-a-Ling Bell Choir for leading us in worship on Maundy-Thursday; thank you to the Archangel Dance Team and the Drama Team for making Good Friday a time of remembering; and thank you to the choir, Sharyn McMaster, and you, the congregation of St. Peter's for giving God praise and honor for His Son, Jesus on Resurrection Sunday. It was a truly worshipful and meaningful Lenten Season.

As I looked at the 30+ children during the Children's Message on Resurrection Sunday, it struck me – these are the most precious gifts from God. There is nothing like being a parent, but one of the greatest things is to be a grand-parent. My grandson, Lucas, is the apple of my eye and I enjoy every minute I get to spend with him. As many of you know, I have off on Fridays and so ever since Lucas was born, I have tried to help Emily by taking care of him on those days. It was a way for her to save from paying for daycare, and it gave me the opportunity to bond with my little buddy.

One Friday, we were sitting on the couch and the cross I wear around my neck was outside my t-shirt. Lucas asked me, "Is that your cross, Dappy?" I said, "Yes it is. Do you know who died on the cross?" He responded, "Jesus!" And I figured this moment was going to be a teaching moment. So I asked him, "Is Jesus still on the cross?" And he quickly said, "Dappy, Jesus arose!" We then began singing the hymn, *Christ Arose*. These kind of precious moments are so special and reminded me that we should all approach spiritual things with the faith of a child.

During the earthly ministry of Jesus, He took time from His busy day to bless and love on children. He taught His disciples that children matter. In fact, He presented them as an important illustration of our faith. He said in the most emphatic of terms, *"Truly I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter at all"* (Mark 10:15). What was Jesus saying to them ... to us?



1. Like a child, our faith must be humble. James 4:6 tells us, "God is opposed to the proud, but gives grace to the humble." If you are proud in heart, you will miss out on the kingdom. There are no peacocks in heaven, strutting around in their arrogance saying, "Look at me!" There are only those gratefully singing, "Amazing grace, how sweet the sound, that saved a wretch like me!" Children are humble because they are in a position to learn from adults. More is caught, than taught! Are you childlike in your faith?

2. Like a child, our faith must be dependent. Little children cannot make it in this world. They are totally dependent on someone to feed them, clothe them, care for them, and provide for them. So it is with our faith. It is totally dependent on Jesus and His salvation. Sadly, so many think they can be saved by their good works. Nothing could be further from the truth. We are saved by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone. Through faith we recognize we are dependent on Jesus.

3. Like a child, our faith must be trusting. Children are naturally very trusting. They tend to believe what adults tell them. They are not jaded, cynical, or suspicious. God wants us to be that way with our faith. He wants us to take Him at His word. Jesus told doubting Thomas, "Stop doubting and believe." (John 20:27). When we truly believe God, as evidenced by our actions, then and only then do we see His glory (John 11:40).

So, as you search your own heart, do you have the faith of a child? Is your faith humble, dependent, and trusting? If not, learn the lesson from Jesus in Mark 10:15 and approach your faith like that of a child! You will be so glad you did.

What would happen if there was a website that presented in dramatic fashion, within a series of short and intriguing videos, the most important decision of our lives?




Thank you to all who participated in the Teacher Appreciation Service.

Library Highlights for May - READ All About It!

As we move into the merry month of May with true spring weather and those longer days some of us really anticipate, hopefully our avid library readers will set their sights on finding just the right book (or books) to dig into! This month the previews include three fiction and two non-fiction books.

I'll start with the fiction finds first, giving you the synopses from the back covers:

"Secrets at Cedar Cabin" (another '**Lavender Tides**' novel by Colleen Coble - last month I previewed **"The House at Saltwater Point"** from the same series):

'Running for her life in the wake of her mother's murder, Bailey Fleming escapes to the only place she can think of - a remote, dilapidated cabin in Lavender Tides. Intending to finally getting to the truth behind the lies of her past, Bailey only finds more questions when bodies are discovered near her cabin hideout along with traces of a dangerous human trafficking ring. In an unlikely partnership with FBI agent Lance Phoenix, Bailey races to understand the mystery surrounding her life and circumstances before the murderer tracks her down. Meanwhile, Lance is determined to rescue his sister Ava, who was abducted after running away from home as a teenager. An unexpected lead brings him to the remote cabin, and he wonders if Bailey - with her suspicious past and strange connections to his sister's case - is really who she claims to be and if she can somehow lead him to Ava.'

"As the Tide Comes In" co-authored by Cindy Woodsmall and daughter-in-law Erin Woodsmall:

'From splintered roots she built an unexpected life - a beautiful one. Will an unshakable nightmare steal it all away? After an unthinkable loss sends Tara Abbott's life spiraling out of control, she flees North Carolina for Georgia's St. Simon's Island. Although confused and scared, she hopes to find answers about her past - her life before the years of foster care and raising her two half-brothers. But there among the moss-clad live oaks and along pristine beaches, her disorientation blurs the lines between imagination and reality, past and present. Will she find steady ground on the island with the help of an eccentric but kindhearted group of older women called the Glynn Girls and also a determined firefighter? Or will the truth take what's left of her identity out with the tide?'

"Shades of Blue" by Karen Kingsbury:

'In between a checkered past and a fairy-tale future, a decision awaits for Brad Cutler. Cutler, age 28, is a rising star at his New York ad agency and about to marry the girl of his dreams. Anyone would agree he has it all - a great career, a beautiful and loving fiancée, and a fairy-tale life ahead of him - when memories of a high school girlfriend begin to torment him. Lost innocence and one very difficult choice flood his conscience, and he is no longer sure of what the future will bring except for this...he must go back to the shores of Holden Beach in search of his first love and a forgiveness neither of them has ever known.'

The two non-fiction books have been written under the auspices of MOPS International (Mothers of Preschoolers) and both have valuable wisdom to impart - here are the blurbs from the book jackets:

"A Mother's Footprints of Faith - Stories of Hope and Encouragement" by Carol Kuykendall:

'Standing at the midpoint of her life, Carol looks back over her shoulder and clearly sees a pattern of footprints - of defining moments in her life when she recognized God's presence and she took a step of growing faith. Many of those footprints marched right through the chaotic days of early marriage and motherhood, caring for three young children. While Carol was chasing toddlers, God was guiding her own steps. Carol's poignant and humorous anecdotes will make you cry, make you laugh, and help you learn, as she reflects on how God often used difficult situations to draw her closer to Himself. With warmth and insight, she touches on the cares and issues every mother knows: life's longings, tricky transitions to marriage and motherhood, daily obstacles such as sick kids and 'no school' days, and temptations like perfectionism and busyness. Carol's experiences reveal the value of perspective - of recognizing that in the rush of daily activities, God is with you. With His help, you'll be able to look back over your own shoulder and discover wealth in the footprints leading up to where you stand.'

"Naked Fruit - Getting Honest About the Fruit of the Spirit" by Elisa Morgan:

'Got fruit?? Living out the character of Jesus is simpler than it seems. Elisa Morgan reveals that it's not always about being kind and happy, but living honestly and reflecting Christ to those around you. In short, easy-to-read chapters, you will see what the fruit of the Spirit looks like in the real world. You will find down-to-earth insight on: why the fruit of the Spirit is important, how to grow it (it doesn't depend solely on you), how to know if you're showing fruit, what each fruit might look like in your own skin, and how to share your 'fruit' attributes with others. Elisa gets honest about each spiritual fruit, guiding you with hope and practical steps for growth. The result will be a life that is believable and influential.'

Please consider checking out these books or any others in our church library that you can dig into, especially before you have to literally start digging into the dirt to begin that spring planting (and weeding) that's probably on your to-do list - happy reading!!

Spotlight on: Angels of Praise

Psalm 149:3 - 'Let them praise His name with dancing and make music to Him with tambourine and harp.' (This has always been the theme verse of the ministry.)

For a number of years, St. Peter's Angels of Praise liturgical dance ministry has had an integral part in our worship on Sunday mornings and at other special services. The ministry began under the auspices of Tammy Stauffer when God gave her the desire to have a dance ministry with our teen girls (and later on, Sara Jacobs came on board to help lead, and also the Jr. Angels of Praise and the Halos of Praise groups were formed so that younger girls could be part of the ministry). In 2010, Emily Bertoti began to lead the ministry, and through the years she has had help from a number of different people, including Emily Eller (now Sweikowski), Amy Rape (now Goldthwaite), Kelly Geis, April Moore, and Bridgette Bertoti (now Stauffer). Emily's love for liturgical dance has always been most evident (she was one of the original members of the ministry) and in the years she has served as the ministry leader, she has not only continued to give our teen and pre-teen girls the opportunity to take part, but she has also expanded the ministry to include other teams, such as the Arc Angels (made up of women - we were blessed to have this team help lead worship just recently on Good Friday) and also the Angel Babies (our littlest girls, who danced with the help of some of our older pre-teen and teen Angels this past Christmas). Since 2005, when the ministry began, we can say three things without a doubt; any of the music that has been chosen to be danced to has always been God-honoring, the choreography has been created to always be reverent and sincere (many of the songs have incorporated the use of actual sign language, which is so beautiful and fluid in its execution), and the dancers have always been 'clothed' in modest humility. We want to thank everyone who has ever been a part of the Angels of Praise ministry, and in particular, we want to let Emily know how much we appreciate her commitment and devotion to this form of worship that has meant so much in her own life. Emily has decided to step down from her leadership responsibilities at this time, but she is hopeful that there is someone within our church family who will be inspired to lead those who would like to be members of this vital worship ministry. We ask that God will bless Emily in all the days ahead and that He will make her aware of how much her leadership of the Angels of Praise has meant to so many for all these years! I am going to close with Emily's own words that she crafted for the ministry's mission statement:

ANGELS OF PRAISE: 'To worship, glorify God, and express our love for Him in our own distinct way. Together as one unit we grow closer to God by reaching out to those who know and those who want to know Him. Conveying our emotions through every move, we hope and strive to bring others closer to God as well as we also grow closer to Him.'




