A Mother Who Prays

My mother was instrumental in my own conversion, as she led me through the gospel as a four year old, when I prayed with her to receive Christ, as she sat in her rocking chair in the nursery of our house. Needless to say, I am a firm believer that it is hard to find a greater power on this planet than a mother who prays to the Lord. President Lincoln once wrote "I remember my mother's prayers and they have always followed me. They have clung to me all my life." No doubt, many of us are who we are (and where we are) today because a mother had prayed for us. This is especially true of praying for the **salvation** of their children. In his own



testimony, St. Augustine wrote of his mother, Monica, as one "now gone from my sight, who for years had wept over me, that I might live in your [God's] sight.". If you're a praying mother, in any phase of life, who is reading this, I have little doubt that you're tired, that your tank is empty. Consider these words a little encouragement boost, reminding you that you're not only doing a good thing in praying for your children <u>daily</u>, but that you need not grow weary in *doing* that good thing (Gal. 6:9). In light of that, consider the prayers of three mothers in scripture, each at a different juncture of the situation which they were praying for:

- Hannah, a prayer of trust before: "O Lord of hosts, if you will indeed look on the affliction of your servant and remember me and not forget your servant, but will give to your servant a son, then I will give him to the Lord all the days of his life I have been pouring out my soul before the Lord " (1 Sam. 1:11, 15)
- Mary, a prayer of trust *during*: "*Behold, I am the servant* [Greek "*slave*"] of the Lord; let it be to me <u>according to your word</u>." (Luke 1:38)
- Miriam, a prayer of trust after: "Sing to the Lord, for he <u>has</u> triumphed gloriously" (Ex. 15:21)

Mothers, no matter what phases of the situation they are in (in their own lives or the lives of their children), find their strength in surrendering it... and themselves... to God, in the sweet and intimate communion of prayer. I am who I am today because my mother Terri [now with the Lord], my mother-in-law Jeanie [who went to be with the Lord last December], and my stepmother Aimee are godly women who committed to pray for me daily. I put forth that all of us ought to follow the example of godly mothers praying daily for our children... and for *everything* life puts before us. That is also why I'm glad that the National Day of Prayer is this month as well, and I hope you'll all take part in that. Happy Mothers Day to all the St. Peter's mothers. I pray we all join you in fervent prayer... for our families... for our church ... for our nation... and most importantly, for the Kingdom of God. *~Pastor David*



Library Highlights for May - READ All About It!

As we move into the month of May with (hopefully!!) warmer spring weather upon us, let us all enjoy reading our books outside as we soak up some sun and dig into some good books!



The following five fiction books have recently be purchased for the library:

"Driving Force" by Lynette Eason presents Kate Angelo: 'Elite Guardians Bodyguard/Former Sniper Christina Sherman has protected uncooperative clients before—but this time, well her client is bossy, headstrong and occasionally eats off the floor. Yes, he's a highly trained military working dog, but certainly her skills could be put to better use, right? Not according to former Special Forces Air Commando Grey Parker. He needs her help to protect his dog while he undergoes an experimental surgery that could restore this ability to walk. He just needs someone to keep his canine partner safe. Most of all, Grey wants back on his feet so he can track down a deranged scientist known as The Scavenger who unleashed a nerve agent that left Grey sidelined in a wheelchair. When an attempt is made on Grey's life, and dead bodies begin piling up—with evidence the same toxin is responsible—suddenly Christina is tasked with keeping both dog and soldier alive... and with them, the secrets that could stop a terrorist attack. But this time, even Christina might be in over her head. Dive into the exciting ignition to the Elite Guardians Collection.'

His teammate, friend, and the woman he secretly loves, Emmy Thorton, joins him. Emmy knows Logan will pursue the investigation no matter the cost. She won't let the man she loves go alone. She needs to be at his side, even if believes she's going simply out of friendship. What looks like a robbery gone wrong rapidly shifts, drawing Emmy and Logan into a dizzying maze where nothing is as it appears. Their only lead is a female drifter who's always one step ahead. Every clue slips through their fingers as threats against them grow deadlier. Having only each other to rely on, their love for one another deepens, but will they live long enough to admit it?'



Angel Tree Camping[®], Prison Fellowship[®] is making camp possible for children with incarcerated parents.

From rope swings and zip lines to horseback riding and swimming, a week with Angel Tree Camping is a chance for these kids to have fun, fellowship with their peers, build relationships with caring camp counselors, and just "be a kid."



An extension of Prison Fellowship's Angel Tree® Christmas program, Angel Tree Camping began in 2002 with a generous donation that fully funded camps to sponsor Angel Tree children for several years. While Prison Fellowship does not directly operate any camp facilities, we rely on partnerships with well-established Christian camp organizations nationwide to sponsor children of prisoners. We support children through partial or full scholarships, and we connect our camping ministry partners with potential campers and the churches that serve them at Christmas.

Some partner camps offer a special session just for Angel Tree campers. Others serve Angel Tree kids throughout their summer season. Angel Tree provides guidance and resources to help churches explain the benefits of camp to the children's caregivers, complete the sign-up process, and help provide any supplies the kids will need for camp. Volunteers receive a supply of quality tote bags and Bibles—one for every sponsored child. And no child leaves camp without hearing the message of Christ's love.
