Pastor's Are Real Too!

"He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds. He determines the number of the stars and calls them each by name. Great is our Lord and mighty in power; his understanding has no limit" Psalm 147:3-5

Hello St. Peter's and Welcome Fall!

Don't you just love this time of year? The leaves are turning their beautiful colors, the air is getting crisp, and sweatshirts are getting pulled from under-the-bed storage. October is Pastor Appreciation month. I don't bring that up so that you will put me on some kind of pedestal, but rather to let you know that Pastors are real too! People often put pastors, like myself, up on a pedestal thinking that we should be holy and perfect; that we are not supposed to sin or make mistakes; that we are supposedly "bullet-proof" as if we don't feel pain, sorrows, or struggles. I am a pastor and that is not the case. I am not perfect. I commit sins, I make mistakes, and I am not exempted from hardships. Like everyone else, I and my fellow pastors, are real people, are real human beings.

This past month has been a tough one for me. As I write this my little buddy, Lucas, is undergoing an exploratory procedure to find out what's wrong with his hip; Kendra continues to be plagued with health issues; my parents are still struggling physically and in need of assisted living arrangements; I've had to watch dear friends deal with the suicide of a loved one; I have made more trips to the hospitals in one week than I can count; and I have had to perform funerals for members that I considered dear, dear friends.

I get it, it's my calling. I knew what I was getting into when I said "Yes!" to God's call. But pastors are real people too! We are exhausted from the countless hours of meetings, hospital visits, and counseling. We get hurt when members choose to leave the church. We get frustrated when division in the church happens. We get angry when people pick on our loved ones. And we spend long hours mulling over the Scriptures to deliver the best message we can week in – week out. We understand what disappointment is; what rejection feels like; and when loneliness touches our lives. You see, pastors are real people.

As I was doing my devotions and waiting for the Lord to touch my heart through His Word. I realized a tear formed and trickled down my cheek. I was brokenhearted. While I know I need to be strong for my grandson, my wife, my parents, and my congregation, I am in pain, suffering emotionally, physically, and spiritually. I need to be ministered to. It was at that moment that the Lord impressed upon me that I don't have to be a pastor all the time, but rather a "Dappy", a husband, a son, and a brother in Christ who is experiencing life just like his family and congregation does on a regular basis.

Thankfully, God is ever-present during these difficult times. I claim God's promise, found in Psalm 147:3-5, "[to] heal the brokenhearted and bind up their wounds: "Great is our Lord and mighty in power... God's understanding has no limit" It is beyond measure. I need these words during this difficult, painful and confusing time, and I claim them as God's answer to my circumstances. I knew then that God would heal me and my broken heart; that He would bind up my wounds; that He would care, treat, and provide for me. I am grateful for how God uses my family, friends and loved ones who – in one way or another – help me in prayer, by encouraging words and doing kind deeds.

You may be going through a tough time right now too. This may be a season of brokenness for you. I want to tell you, it is okay to be real and vulnerable. It's okay to feel the pain and sorrow. Be broken before the Lord. Know that God is close to the brokenhearted. God will heal you, and God will take care of you. You may not know or understand the purpose of your circumstances. I tell you, it is okay to be confused and to struggle with God. God is great and powerful, and He knows what you are going through. His wisdom is beyond what our mind could ever comprehend or grasp. Remember, God's thoughts are not our thoughts and God's ways are higher than our ways (Isaiah 55: 8-9). As you go through this time of brokenness, respond by singing, praising and thanking God. Respond with reverence and hope. Others may not have hope in God, but you do – we do—TOGETHER.



LIBRARY HIGHLIGHTS FOR OCTOBER - READ ALL ABOUT IT!!!!

Several great 'reads and watches' are new to the library this month. I'll start out with a few novels and end with a few DVD selections - here goes:

NOVELS

Best-selling author Jan Karon's latest Mitford novel (#14 in the series) is titled **"To Be Where You Are"** and the book jacket describes things this way: 'After twelve years of wrestling with the conflicts of retirement, Father Tim Kavanaugh realizes he doesn't need a steady job to prove himself. Then he's given one - as for what it proves, heaven only knows. Millions of Jan Karon's fans will be thrilled that it's life as usual in the wildly popular Mitford series: A beloved town character lands a front-page obituary, but who was it, exactly, who died? And what about the former mayor, born the year Lindbergh landed in Paris, who's still running for office? All this, of course, is but a feather on the wind compared to 'Muse' editor J. C. Hogan's desperate attempts to find a cure for his marital woes. Will it be high-def TV or his pork chop marinade? In fiction, as in real life, there are no guarantees. Twenty minutes from Mitford at Meadowgate Farm, newlyweds Dooley and Lace face a crisis that devastates their bank account and impacts their family vet practice. But there is still a lot to celebrate, as their adopted son, Jack, looks forward to the most important day of his life - with great cooking, country music, and lots of people who love him. Happily, it will also be a day when the terrible rift in Dooley's biological family begins to heal because of a game (let's just call it a miracle) that breaks all the rules. In **"To Be Where You Are"**, Karon weaves together the richly comic and compelling lives of two Kavanaugh families, and a cast of characters that readers around the world now love like kin.'

For all of you who have never read the Mitford series, all of the novels are delightful as they portray small-town church life in very insightful, sometimes tear-producing, and often very humorous ways. When you start reading the first one, I believe you will immediately be ready to dive into the next one (and on and on!!)

DVDS

Pastor Jim has donated a very funny DVD titled **"Laughing on Purpose"** that features comedian Michael Jr. in a great stand-up routine. The back of the cover states: 'With multiple appearances on late night television, such as The Tonight Show with Jay Leno, Jimmy Kimmel Live, and Comedy Central, comedian Michael Jr. has made a name for himself. He has compiled his family-focused, laid back stand-up style into this - his first solo comedy special on DVD. His comedy has proven to be edgy enough for Las Vegas and clean enough to be enjoyed in church. **"Laughing on Purpose"** will push you to laugh until your face hurts, and yet will inspire you at the same time.'

Here is another DVD offering from Kirk Cameron titled **"Unstoppable - Where is God in the Midst of Tragedy and Suffering?"** The blurb on the back describes it this way: 'In this powerful visual journal, Kirk Cameron takes viewers on a personal, inspiring, and hope-filled journey to better understand the biggest doubt-raising question of our faith: "Where is God in the midst of tragedy and suffering?" Going back to the beginning - Genesis - Kirk investigates the origins of good and evil and how they impact our lives...and our eternities.'

Special features on the DVD include a 13 minute behind-the-scenes featurette and Warren Barfield's **"The Time is Now"** music video.

To tie into the Mitford series, the last DVD to be previewed is a Hallmark original movie produced a few years ago and titled **"At Home in Mitford."** While it takes some liberties with the story line of the first novel (also titled **"At Home in Mitford"**), it captures the true hometown feel and warmth that is the essence of Jan Karon's style. The synopsis on the cover states: 'With a case of writer's block, children's author Cynthia Coppersmith escapes to small-town Mitford for a change of scenery. She soon finds the heart and soul of the southern town in an Episcopal priest (Father Tim Kavanaugh) as they work together to care for a young boy who has lost his family. With heartbreak in their pasts, Cynthia and Father Tim must find the courage and faith to grab an unexpected chance at true love.'

Happy reading and watching in October, and don't forget that in addition to what has been previewed, there are so many other great fiction and non-fiction books as well as reference materials and DVDs available in our church library - come 'check it (or them) out'!!

The goal has been and will continue to be that together everyone will strive to keep our kitchen clean and organized to the point where Kim and other faithful volunteers won't be spending huge amounts of time doing that for the rest of us. VETERANS' WISH LIST

St. Peter's once again has the opportunity to help the Butler VA Hospital by supplying 'comfort items' to meet their ongoing needs. For the weeks of October 20 through November 10, we will have a bin labeled 'Veterans' Wish List' in the Gathering Area where you can place your donated items. Right now they are particularly in need of body wash, shampoo, and laundry detergent (regular and hypoallergenic), but you can also donate personal care/comfort items from the following list that has been given to us by Butler VA Healthcare: chap stick, lotion, body spray, deodorant, shaving cream/gel, double edge razors or high quality razors, nail files, nail clippers, blankets, fabric softener (liquid and dryer sheets), nail polish, nail polish remover, nail sticks, cotton balls and Q-tips, aftershave and mouthwash (both have to be alcohol-free) and denture adhesives (Polident, Fixodent).

Supplying these items is just one more way our church can be the 'hands and feet of Jesus', reaching out to our veterans who need help and hope at any time of the year!

I'll close with a Scriptural gem that is vitally important for everyone who strives to serve God with their gifts and talents. May the Apostle Paul's words from Galatians 6:9 bless and encourage all of us in all we do - 'And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart.'

Capital Campaign Update

The Long Range Capital Team met regularly throughout the summer to make recommendations on several projects and to continue to research and identify the scope of others. After securing three bids for both the painting of the church and the replacement of the gutters of the educational building, the team made recommendations to Consistory that Konvolinka Painting and Suburban Insulation complete the work. The team recommended to Consistory that they utilize the capital budget line item in the 2019 budget for the payment for each of these projects. These projects were approved by Consistory and will most likely be completed in October, once the roof is complete.

The team reached out to three concrete contractors who confirmed that the front steps are in good condition and only require for the Trustees to install caulking to fill in some of the cracks. JJ Kennedy Concrete, Josh Rader, and Steven Fredrick have graciously offered their materials and labor to replace the sidewalk in front of the church steps at no cost to the church.

The team was able to identify a qualified individual that has worked on several organ renovations at other churches who provided excellent feedback on the organ repair estimate. Consistory is now managing the organ and pipe project repair and replacement project that began this summer. The team is currently working on getting bids to upgrade our Sanctuary audio visual equipment, replace the Fellowship Hall kitchen sink, and to purchase a door card access system. We will continue to keep the Congregation informed of the ongoing progress on these projects and any other projects that arise. If any member has a question, please contact myself or any member of the team.


