

Hope is Here

"Blessed is the one ... whose delight is in the law of the Lord, and who meditates on his law day and night. That person is like a tree planted by streams of water ..."
Psalm 1:1-3

Greetings in the name of our Divine Creator!

Can you believe we are getting ready to welcome fall in less than a month? Where did the summer go? If you remember in last month's Joyful Newsletter, I shared about me and Kendra's excursion to the treehouse in Berlin, Ohio. We were so taken by the beauty of being surrounded by the majestic trees. The serenity and tranquility of that experience was awe-inspiring. A few days after that publication, I happened to be surfing the net and came across the following picture, depicting the intricate roots and life rings of the tree:



To me, this picture is evidence and supports what we as believers in Christ know, that there is a great and divine Creator! If you are not amazed by the similarities between humanity and God's beautiful nature, I don't know what more evidence would or could convince you. I appreciate how God often uses the trees in the Bible as a source of life and death (spiritually speaking!) In the beginning God gave Adam one simple command, "You are free, but do not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil." Of all the trees God created, fruit bearing, flowing and shade producing, Adam could enjoy all but one. But the lust of the flesh. The lust of the eyes, and the pride of life took over ... well, you know how well that ended! Thanks Adam!



Interestingly, this morning my devotions were in the Psalms, specifically Psalm 1, where the Psalmist reminds us of how a blessed man is one who “does not walk in the counsel of the wicked or stands in the way of sinners, or sits in the seat of mockers” (vs. 1). I see this as yet another warning from God to turn away from the ways of this world and trust and believe in His ways, which are life-giving to all people who will seek Him and His Word.

And then the Psalmist makes reference to the tree—that when we are rooted in God’s Word “meditating on it day and night” (vs. 2) we will “yield great fruit and not wither” (vs. 3). When I read those words and meditated on them this morning, I was reminded of when I listen to the world or do what the world does or goes where the world goes, I’m destined to fail. But if I stay close to God and His Word, I will prosper and be blessed.

September is back to church month and our theme this year is “Hope is Here!” After coming through a year plagued by a pandemic and now being faced with a variant of this virus, may I encourage you to be strong like the tree and derive your nourishment, strength, and courage from the One who provides for our every need. In Psalm 1:6, we are told that “the Lord watches over the way of the righteous.” Take another look at the photo ... be encouraged that our hearts, nerves, lungs, and even our fingerprints bear God’s intricate design, just like the trees, and because of that ... we have hope!

I hope to see you all in church this fall! Stay strong ... stay safe ... have hope!

"Open Doors USA is a community of Christians who come together to support persecuted believers in more than 60 countries.


We are a 501c3, non-profit organization with more than 60 years of experience and a long track record of financial integrity.

The first four books are non-fiction and have been added to the church library:

These next four books were given in the memory of Mary Lou Burkett by Rick and Lynn Meyers:


After Math, by Terri Blackstock: 'A devastating explosion. Three best friends are at the venue to hear their favorite band. Only one makes it out alive. A trunk full of evidence. When police stop Dustin Webb with a warrant to search his trunk, he knows there's been a mistake. He's former military and owns a security firm. But he's horrified when the officers find explosives, and he can't fathom how they got there. An attorney who will risk it all for an old friend. Criminal attorney Jamie Powell was Dustin's best friend growing up. They haven't spoken since he left for basic training, but she's the first person he thinks of when he's arrested. Jamie knows she's putting her career on the line by defending an accused terrorist, but she'd never abandon him. Someone is framing Dustin to take the fall for shocking acts of violence... but why?'

Obsession, Book 2 of the Natchez Trace Park Rangers series, by Patricia Bradley: 'Natchez Trace Ranger and historian Emma Winters hoped never to see Sam Ryker again after she broke off her engagement to him. But when shots are fired at her at a historical landmark just off the Natchez Trace, she's forced to work alongside Sam as the Natchez Trace law enforcement district ranger in the ensuing investigation. To complicate matters, Emma has acquired a delusional secret admirer who is determined to have her as his own. Sam is merely an obstruction, one which must be removed. Sam knows that he has failed Emma in the past, and he doesn't intend to let her down again. Especially now that her life is on the line.'

The Chase, Book 2 of the US Marshals series, by Lisa Harris: 'US Marshal Madison James may not be sure who shot her three months ago, but she does know one thing—it's time to get back out into the field. When her partner, Jonas Quinn, receives a message that a federal warrant just came in on a man connected to a string of bank robberies, Madison jumps at the chance to get back to work. What she and Jonas find is a bank robbery in progress that's gone wrong—and things are about to get worse. For these bank robbers, it's never been just about the money. It's about taking risks and adrenaline rushes, and getting caught is not part of the game. When the suspects escape, Madison and Jonas must hunt them down and bring them to justice before someone else—someone close to them—gets hurt ... or worse. From Seattle to the San Juan Islands, bestselling author Lisa Harris takes you on a nonstop chase where feelings are complicated and failure isn't an option.'

Hostile Intent, Book 4 of the Danger Never Sleeps series, by Lynette Eason: 'Ava Jackson entered the military shortly after high school, but her mother's illness has forced her to request an early discharge. She already lost her father while deployed, and there's no way she's going to let her mother die alone. But after a visit to the nursing facility where her mother lives, Ava is attacked walking back to her car. Fortunately, FBI Special Agent Caden Denning arrives in time to help fight off her attacker. Caden reveals to Ava that she may hold the key to the murders of three families, and he needs her help before anyone else is harmed. The hits show a pattern, and clearly the killer has an agenda. But if Caden and Ava can't discover what it is, Ava may be next on the list.'
